- 3.1 Staff presented the annual investment cost report for fiscal year 2022. On motion of Todd Ingalsbee, the Retirement Board voted unanimously to accept the Fiscal Year 2022 Investment Cost Report, as submitted.
- 3.2 There were no recommended changes to the Interim Investment Directives for the PERS', Legislators', and Judicial funds.

- 4.1 On motion of Todd Ingalsbee, the Retirement Board voted unanimously, to elect Brian Wallace as the Vice Chair of the Retirement Board for fiscal year 2023.
- 4.2 On motion of Brian Wallace, the Retirement Board voted unanimously to confirm the appointment of Ian Carr as the General Counsel of the Public Employees' Retirement System of Nevada at a step 5 in the General Counsel pay schedule, effective February 3, 2023, as submitted.
- 4.3 On motion of Brian Wallace, the Retirement Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the Retirement Board Education Session and Retirement Board meeting held December 8, 2022, as submitted.
- 4.4 There were no recommended changes to the Retirement Board meeting dates.
- 4.5 On motion of Brian Wallace, the Retirement Board voted unanimously to approve the month of June's topic to be the PERIS project and the month of July's topic to be Capital Market Assumption Update.

- 5.3 On motion of Brian Wallace, the Retirement Board voted unanimously to approve the modified actuarial tables for the optional benefit factors with an implementation date of March 16, 2023, as submitted by the System's actuary in accordance with NRS 286.190, 286.534, and 286.590.
- 5.4 Staff provided an update on the pension administration system project. There was no action on this item.
